was the premiere non-professional theatre for *Telemachus Clay* and The School for Scandal by Lewis John Carlino. Both plays went on to be purchased by Dramatist Play Service, Inc. WICA was the first nonprofessional theatre in the country to win the rights to *The Understudy* by Teresa Rebeck, one of the first nonunion houses to win the right to A Doll's House, Part 2, and one of only three theatre companies given the rights to produce Dr. Horrible's Sing-along Blog.

- We opened our piano bar in Zech Hall in 2014. **Over 30** local musicians play the piano for pre-show patrons.
- Local visual artists display their work year-round in the Kristin and **Earl Lasher Gallery**

training program is based on a college course and prepares stage managers to work professionally. WICA has seen people come through the program and work at other arts organizations on the island as well as move into Stage Management in college or off-island.

WICA offers a vibrant cultural exchange on our stage by bringing artists and speakers from around the world. Past guests have come from Russia, Ireland, Cuba, Scotland, U.K., Brazil, Canada, France, Spain, and Mexico.


OUR MISSION


